New rate structure coming May 1

The board of directors and management have been working over the last few months to examine our Cost of Service Study (COSS) results and how we can adjust our rates closer to the results. The board voted on rate modifications at the January board meeting.

The modifications ensure that rates are fair and equitable for all members and ensure that each rate class is paying for the proper costs associated with that cost of service. Each member should pay their fair share of costs without having one class subsidizing another. The COSS also revealed that a Demand Charge should be added to the rate classes. This is currently a zero charge on your bill. Demand is the maximum rate at which your household consumed electricity during the billing month, but only during peak hours (6 a.m. - 9 p.m.). In addition, residential rates will see an increase in the base service charge and a slight decrease in the kWh charge. Members enrolled in our Time-of-Use program will also see a change.

Details on these rate changes will be in our next couple publications.

Prepaid Billing Option

Riverland Energy now offers a prepaid billing option for members who would like an alternative to the traditional method of billing. Prepaid allows members to pay for their power up front with the funds being withdrawn from their account as they use energy.

A member enrolled in prepaid billing will have money withdrawn from their account every day following a daily bill calculation. The funds that are withdrawn will cover the energy and flat costs associated with providing electricity to that member along with additional taxes and fees.

Once an account reaches the low credit balance threshold of \$15, or the amount you select, you will receive a daily email, text or automated phone message.

BEST BETS FOR Winter Savings


Energy consumption spikes during winter months as we spend more time indoors and heating systems work overtime. You can help reduce demand and strain on the electric grid by conserving during peak energy times. Reducing energy use will also help lower your energy bills.

UNPLUG WHEN POSSIBLE




Turn off unnecessary lights and electronics when you aren't using them.

ELIMINATE DRAFTS AND AIR LEAKS




Seal air leaks and drafts around windows and exterior doors.

USE APPLIANCES WHEN ENERGY DEMAND IS LOWER




Run large appliances like clothes washers, dryers and dishwashers early in the morning or before you go to bed.

MAINTAIN HEATING EQUIPMENT



Maintain your heating system by replacing dirty, clogged filters and scheduling an annual inspection for necessary maintenance.

LOWER THE THERMOSTAT



Home heating accounts for a large portion of energy consumption. Adjust your thermostat to the lowest comfortable setting (68 degrees or lower).
