District Committee Elections & Annual Meeting Information

This month, members in Districts 3, 4, and 8 received a list of eligible members in their districts for nomination to the District Committee. Voting for these representatives is an important way to exercise your rights as a cooperative member. Once elected, District Committee representatives will participate in a meeting later in February and serve a four-year term, with the option for re-election at the end of their term.

The District Committee Meeting is an important opportunity for members to actively participate in the cooperative's governance by nominating candidates for director positions, emphasizing the cooperative difference and your member-driven right to choose our leadership. At the meeting, members will also receive updates on the cooperative's financial performance, accomplishments from 2025, and strategic plans for 2026. Specifically, during the 2026 District Committee Meeting, director nominations will be held for Districts 2, 5, and 9. The elections for these positions will follow in March, with the winners announced during the Annual Meeting.

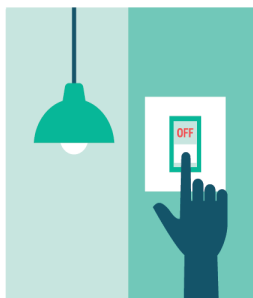

CHANGE YOUR HABITS

To Save Money on Your Energy Bill



Whether you are looking for free or low-cost ways to save energy or need to make a major purchase that will help pay for itself over time due to energy savings, here are some ways to make a difference.



No-Cost

- Turn off lights when you leave a room.
- Program your programmable thermostat.
- Use sunlight for heat in the winter.
- Fully load dishwashers, clothes washers and dryers.
- Use window coverings to keep out cold or heat.
- Turn off electronics when not in use.



Low-Cost

- Use smart strips that turn off power to unused items.
- Make sure your HVAC system is serviced regularly and filters are changed as often as recommended.
- Purchase an insulating blanket made for hot water heaters.
- Find and fill air leaks in your home.
- Caulk between window/door frames and walls.
- Install a smart thermostat.



Major Purchases

- Upgrade to a high-efficiency HVAC system.
- Purchase energy-efficient appliances.
- Insulate attics, exterior walls, basements and crawl spaces.
- Purchase a clothes dryer with a moisture sensor.
- Purchase a water-saving dishwasher or washing machine.
- Replace old windows with energy-efficient versions.
