Appliance Recycling Rebate

Riverland Energy offers a \$25 rebate on refrigerator, freezer and air conditioner recycling. A rebate form is required and can be found on our website at riverlandenergy.com.

Prepaid Billing Option

Riverland Energy's new Prepaid Billing Program is an optional program for members to pre-pay for their electricity. Instead of receiving a bill at the end of the month for power you have already used – you have the flexibility of purchasing electricity when you want. Pay amounts that fit your budget – daily, weekly, or monthly.

Because you pay in advance on prepaid billing, you control how much you use and spend before you get billed for it. Keeping an eye on your account in SmartHub helps you recognize how you use electricity and when you need to cut back to stay on budget.

If your funds get depleted, you get a notification prior to service being disconnected. This gives you a chance to make a payment without ever losing service.

Dual Fuel Program

Members can receive a special low dual fuel electric rate for electric heating systems wired for peak load control under the Dual Fuel program. Under this program, the electric heat is metered separately and can be switched off during peak demand periods via a load control receiver installed by a Riverland Energy technician.

Dual fuel is having two sources of heat to your home. Having one form of controlled electric heat and another heat source (like a gas furnace) that will provide the heat for your home through peak times when we control electric heat.

The dual fuel rate is not as low during the summer months because there are not as many loads that we can effectively control to reduce the peak during summer months. People typically would not like their air conditioners controlled for more than 15-minute cycling, which means we cannot reduce the peaks as effectively during the summer as we can during the winter.

We are charged more as a cooperative during the summer since our overall consumption is higher in the winter.

Beginning May 1, 2024, if there is a controlled water heater on the meter, an additional \$4.00 monthly credit will be applied during June- September and \$5.00 monthly credit for a controlled AC unit June - September.

To receive the dual fuel electric rate, you must contact the office and fill out an agreement form.
