Riverland Energy can help with the cost of

energy assessments and improvements

f your electric bill seems higher than normal and you haven't changed any routines in your home, it may be time to look into having an energy assessment, and perhaps an audit by a certified energy auditor.

Riverland Energy Cooperative is your liaison for professional home energy audits by a certified energy auditor. Riverland Energy offers a \$150 credit toward the cost of the home energy audit. The audit must be done by a state-certified energy audit specialist. The bill for the audit will be sent to Riverland Energy Cooperative and will be charged to your electric bill, less the \$150 credit.

An energy audit takes approximately 2-3 hours and includes:

- Blower door test (check air sealing, air exchanges/ hour)
- Measuring attic insulation
- Using an infrared camera to check insulation/cold spots on floors and walls
- A detailed list of energy-saving measures
- One follow-up visit for re-testing after recommended correction measure have been made

Energy assessments can be performed any season.

Once the energy assessment is complete, the certified energy auditor will prepare a complete report for the homeowner and Riverland Energy. Recommendations are also provided within the report to help homeowners identify any improvements that can be made to help save energy and reduce electric bills. REC provides up to \$500 rebate towards the cost of energy-saving measures implemented from the auditor's recommendations, based on approved invoices. Qualifications can be found on the rebate form.

If you're interested in receiving an energy assessment/audit, please contact Riverland Energy at 800-411-9115 and ask for Tammy H. She will help assess your general situation and provide the certified energy auditor with your contact information. The auditor will contact you to schedule an appointment.

BEWARE OF SCAMS

R iverland Energy reminds members to be suspicious of calls asking for payment information. Scammers call threatening to disconnect your utility service, demanding immediate payment, and insist you call them back with the card information to make payment. They often use caller ID spoofing, and their call-back numbers may even include recorded replicas of utility company greetings.

If you receive a suspicious call, please call Riverland to verify the request for payment before providing any personal information. Also, report scammer calls to the Federal Trade Commission. The FTC also provides great information on identifying scammers and how to protect yourself.
