increase much higher. Below




are some tips to help reduce usage between 11 am and 7 pm:

- Set thermostat to 78 degrees or at least a few degrees higher than normal
- Set up a schedule for your programmable/smart thermostat
- Close curtains and blinds during the day to keep it cooler inside and use ceiling fans to circulate air
- Operate washers, dryers, dishwashers, and other major appliances before 6 am or after 9 pm
- Charge electric vehicles after 9 pm
- If you must use a dehumidifier, set it on a timer and preferably after 9 pm
- Enjoy lunch or dinner by grilling outdoors a few days a week to prevent using the stove and heating up your home

Load Management Program:

Members who participate in the load management program and allow their central air conditioner to be controlled via a load control device will receive a \$5.00 credit on their electric bill for June, July, August, and September. During peak control days, central air conditioners are typically cycled 15 minutes on then 15 minutes off for up to four hours.
